Maine State Legislature Recap

The Maine State Legislature returns to work tomorrow, May 2, 2018 for what is referred to as "veto" day, where they will decide to either sustain or override the remaining bills the Governor vetoed during their recess. Beyond that, it's uncertain when, or even if, they will return to the Statehouse prior to adjourning the 128th Legislature.

This session has had many different turns and the final disposition of pending legislation is not clear. When they left the building during the (very) early morning of April 20th, they did so in a posture that preserved all pending legislation, leaving the statutory window open for a potential return to work to deal with the issues that remain to be decided.

With some very high profile (along with many "not so high profile") issues still up-in-the-air, including bonds, school funding, Medicaid Expansion, and tax conformity, it would seem likely that they will indeed come back at some point in the near future to deal with unfinished business. That said, when it comes to the current composition of the Legislature, you never really know.

One thing is certain though, when all is said and done, the issues debated in the 128th Maine State Legislature will go in the books as some of the most interesting, complex, and challenging we've seen in recent years. Stay tuned, as there will be more to report when they finally do wrap-up their work.






